- To amend title 11, United States Code, to prohibit nonconsensual release of a nondebtor entity's liability to an entity other than the debtor, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Nondebtor Release
- 5 Prohibition Act of 2024".

1 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION OF NONDEBTOR RELEASES.

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 1 of title 11, United
3 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol4 lowing:

5 "§ 113. Prohibition of nondebtor releases

6 "(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this sec7 tion, subsection (a)(3), (g), (h), or (i) of section 524, sec8 tion 1201, and section 1301, the court may not—

9 "(1) with respect to the liability of an entity 10 other than the debtor or the estate on, or the liabil-11 ity of property of an entity other than the debtor or 12 the estate for, a claim or cause of action of an entity 13 other than the debtor or the estate—

"(A) approve any provision, in a plan of
reorganization or otherwise, for the discharge,
release, termination, or modification of such liability; or

18 "(B) order the discharge, release, termi19 nation, or modification of such liability; or

"(2) with respect to a claim or cause of action
of an entity other than the debtor or the estate
against an entity other than the debtor or the estate,
or against property of an entity other than the debtor or the estate, enjoin—

25 "(A) the commencement or continuation26 (including the issuance or employment of proc-

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1	ess) of a judicial, administrative, or other action
2	or proceeding to assert, assess, collect, recover,
3	offset, recoup, or otherwise enforce such claim
4	or cause of action; or
5	"(B) any act to assert, assess, collect, re-
6	cover, offset, recoup, or otherwise enforce such
7	claim or cause of action.
8	"(b) Nothing in subsection (a) of this section shall
9	affect any power the court may have—
10	((1) to authorize a sale, transfer, or other dis-
11	position of property free and clear of claims or inter-
12	ests;
13	((2) to prevent an entity other than the debtor
14	or the estate from exercising control over or other-
15	wise interfering with a right or interest (including a
16	claim or cause of action) that is property of the es-
17	tate;
18	"(3) to bar a claim or cause of action for in-
19	demnity, reimbursement, contribution, or subroga-
20	tion against an entity that the estate has released
21	from a claim or cause of action for which the holder
22	of the barred claim or cause of action also is or may
23	be liable or has or may have secured;
24	"(4) under applicable nonbankruptcy law, title
25	28, or the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure,

1	with respect to any claim or cause of action the
2	court is hearing under section 157(a) or 1334(b) of
3	title 28;
4	"(5) to approve any disposition of a claim or
5	cause of action of an entity other than the debtor or
6	the estate to which such entity expressly consents in
7	a signed writing provided that—
8	"(A) such consent is given only after clear
9	and conspicuous notice to such entity of the
10	proposed disposition in language appropriate
11	for the typical holder of such claim or cause of
12	action;
13	"(B) such consent cannot be given by—
14	"(i) accepting a proposed plan; or
15	"(ii) failing to accept or reject a pro-
16	posed plan, failing to object to a proposed
17	plan, or any other silence or inaction; and
18	"(C) treatment of such entity, and any
19	claims or interests of such entity, under a plan
20	cannot be more or less favorable by reason of
21	such entity's consent or failure to consent; or
22	"(6) to enjoin the commencement or continu-
23	ation (including the issuance or employment of proc-
24	ess) of a judicial, administrative, or other action or
25	proceeding against an entity appointed or employed

(or whose appointment or employment was approved) by or under the auspices of the court, in another court and without leave of the court, with respect to acts or omissions for which the entity was so appointed or employed.

6 "(c) In a case under chapter 11 of this title, no order 7 or decree temporarily staving or enjoining, pursuant to 8 this title, the commencement or continuation (including 9 the issuance or employment of process) of a judicial, administrative, or other action or proceeding to assert, as-10 sess, collect, recover, offset, recoup, or otherwise enforce 11 12 a claim or cause of action against an entity other than the debtor or the estate against an entity other than the 13 debtor or the estate, or against property of an entity other 14 15 than the debtor or the estate, shall extend (or be extended) beyond 90 days after the date of the order for relief with-16 17 out the express consent of the entity whose claim or cause of action is stayed or enjoined. 18

19 "(d) Nothing in subsection (b) or (c) shall be con20 strued to authorize relief within the scope of subsection
21 (b) or (c).".

(b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
for chapter 1 of title 11, United States Code, is amended
by adding at the end the following:

"113. Prohibition of nondebtor releases.".

1 SEC. 3. APPEAL OF NONDEBTOR STAYS.

2 Section 158 of title 28, United States Code, is
3 amended—

4 (1) in subsection (a), by striking "The" and in5 serting "Except as provided in subsection (d)(3),
6 the"; and

7 (2) by inserting after subsection (d)(2) the fol-8 lowing:

9 "(3)(A) The appropriate court of appeals shall 10 have jurisdiction of appeals from all orders and de-11 crees (whether interlocutory or final) temporarily 12 staying or enjoining (or increasing the duration of 13 any temporary stay or injunction of) the commence-14 ment or continuation (including the issuance or em-15 ployment of process) of a judicial, administrative, or 16 other action or proceeding to assert, assess, collect, 17 recover, offset, recoup, or otherwise enforce a claim 18 or cause of action of an entity other than the debtor 19 or the estate against an entity other than the debtor 20 or the estate, or against property of an entity other 21 than the debtor or the estate, entered in a case 22 under chapter 11 of title 11 by—

23 "(i) a bankruptcy judge under section 157
24 of this title; or

25 "(ii) a district court under section 1334 of26 this title.

"(B) If an appeal is taken under subparagraph
(A), the stay order or decree shall immediately terminate and dissolve and be of no further force or effect 90 days after its issuance by the bankruptcy
judge or district court, unless the appeal is dismissed or the court of appeals affirms the stay order
or decree before that date.".

8 SEC. 4. DIVISIONAL MERGERS.

9 Section 1112 of title 11, United States Code, is10 amended—

(1) by redesignating subsection (f) as sub-section (g); and

13 (2) by inserting after subsection (e) the fol-14 lowing:

15 "(f) On a request of a party in interest, and after 16 notice and a hearing, the court shall dismiss a case under 17 this chapter if the debtor or a predecessor of the debtor 18 was the subject of, or was formed or organized in connec-19 tion with a divisional merger or equivalent transaction or 20 restructuring that—

- 21 "(1) had the intent or foreseeable effect of—
- 22 "(A) separating material assets from mate23 rial liabilities of an entity eligible to be a debtor
 24 under this title; and

"(B) assigning or allocating all or a sub stantial portion of those liabilities to the debtor,
 or the debtor assuming or retaining all or a
 substantial portion of those liabilities; and

5 "(2) occurred during the 10-year period pre6 ceding the date of the filing of the petition.".

7 SEC. 5. RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.

8 Nothing in this Act, or the amendments made by this 9 Act, shall be construed to independently grant the court 10 authority to issue nondebtor releases, injunctions, or stays in connection with an order for relief under chapter 11 11 12 of title 11, United States Code, or in connection with an order confirming a plan of reorganization, nor shall any-13 thing in this Act or such amendments be construed to 14 15 imply that any other provision of title 11 of such Code or of nonbankruptcy law grants such authority. 16

17 SEC. 6. EFFECTIVE DATE.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in subsection
(b), this Act and the amendments made by this Act shall
take effect on the date of the enactment of this Act and
shall apply to any case under title 11, United States Code,
that is—

(1) pending in bankruptcy as of the date of theenactment of this Act; or

(2) filed or reopened on or after the date of the
 enactment of this Act.

3 (b) VALIDITY OF FINAL ORDERS.—Nothing in this
4 Act, or the amendments made by this Act, shall affect the
5 validity of any final judgment, order, or decree as applied
6 under section 158 of title 28, United States Code, entered
7 before the date of the enactment of this Act.
