Since 2012, the program has given 21 awards — not just to big companies, but also small and medium-sized enterprises, startups, universities, and nonprofits. Together, their work has improved millions of lives around the globe.

In addition to receiving public recognition of their work, winners will be issued certificates entitling them to expedite select proceedings at the USPTO.

Innovations recognized in the past have included:

- Better ways to diagnose and treat HIV, malaria, tuberculosis, and other diseases
- Improved crops and better sources of nutrition
- Energy sources for those without a reliable electric grid
- Clean drinking water and safer sanitation

Commercial markets and human progress can go hand in hand.
