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Testimony of the Metro Detroit AFL-CIO Regarding Michigan's PA 4 Before the House Judiciary Committee February 21, 2012

Thank you for your time Mr. Chair. My name is Chris Michalakis, and I am the Secretary-Treasurer of the Metro Detroit AFL-CIO. We represent over 200,000 working family in Wayne, Oakland, and Macomb counties who work in a very wide variety of industries in the public and private sectors.

Michigan's Public Act 4, also known as the "Emergency Manager Law" is a presidentbreaking attack on democracy at the local level as well as an attack on democracy at the workplace. Consider some of the provisions in this dangerous law:

- Emergency managers answer only to the state Treasurer, an appointed position, not to any of the constituents they represent.
- Emergency managers have the power to merge entire cities and counties without any input from its citizens
- Emergency managers can suspend, alter, or eliminate collective bargaining agreements without any input from the union membership, or the local communities.
- Emergency managers can layoff and privatize any public employee without any checks and balances from any elected officials.

Mr. Chair, as I talk to members of the Metro Detroit AFL-CIO, they tell me that this law is NOT about helping schools and local communities, but that this law is a blatant power grab that threatens our democracy! This is a law about taking away people's voting rights, and worker's collective bargaining rights!

Mr. Chair, over 200,000 voters in the state of Michigan have signed a petition saying that they want to challenge this law in November. I ask everyone in this room to send a message to representatives in Lansing to not take away our ability to vote on this issue through a ballot referendum.

When communities are suffering, we should be working together to find solutions to help each other through these hard times, NOT kicking them while they are down.
